Course Descriptions

CSME 1405 Fundamentals of Cosmetology

A course in the basic fundamentals of cosmetology. Topics include service preparation, manicure, facial, chemical services, shampoo, haircut, wet styling, and comb out. Semester Hours 4 (2 lec/8 lab)

CSME 1451 Artistry of Hair, Theory & Practice

Instruction in the artistry of hair design. Topics include theory, techniques, and application of hair design. Semester Hours 4 (2 lec/8 lab)

CSME 1443 Manicuring & Related Theory

Presentation of the theory and practice of nail services. Topics include terminology, application, and workplace competencies related to nail services. Semester Hours 4 (2 lec/8 lab)

CSME 1453 Chemical Reformation & Related Theory

Presentation of the theory and practice of chemical reformation including terminology, application, and workplace competencies. Prerequisites: Completion of the following courses with at least a grade of C: CSME 1405, 1443, and 1451. Semester Hours 4 (2 lec/8 lab)

CSME 2401 Principles of Hair Coloring & Related Theory

Presentation of the theory, practice, and chemistry of hair color. Topics include terminology, application, and workplace competencies related to hair color. Prerequisites: Successful completion of CSME 1405, 1443, and 1451 with minimum grade C. Semester Hours 4 (2 lec/8 lab)

CSME 2439 Advanced Hair Design

Advanced concepts in the theory and practice of hair design. Prerequisites: Successful completion of CSME 1405, 1443, and 1451 with minimum grade C. Semester Hours 4 (2 lec/6 lab)

CSME 2237 Advanced Cosmetology Techniques

Mastery of advanced cosmetology techniques, including hair designs, professional cosmetology services, and workplace competencies. Prerequisites: Successful completion CSME 1405, 1443, and 1451 with minimum grade C. Semester Hours 2 (0 lec/7 lab)

CSME 2441 Preparation for State Licensing Exam

Preparation for the state licensing examination. Prerequisites: Successful completion of CSME 1453, 2237, 2401, and 2439 with minimum grade C. Semester Hours 4 (1 lec/9 lab)

CSME 2430 Nail Enhancement

A course in the theory, application, and related technology of nail enhancements. Prerequisites: Successful completion of CSME 1453, 2237, 2401, and 2439 with minimum grade of C. Semester Hours 4 (2 lec/4 lab)

CSME 1447 Principles of Skin Care/Facials & Related Theory

In-depth coverage of the theory and practice of skin care, facials, and cosmetics. Prerequisites: Successful completion of CSME 1453, 2237, 2401, and 2439 with minimum grade of C. Semester Hours 4 (2 lec/5 lab)

CSME 2443 Salon Development

Procedures necessary for salon development. Topics include professional ethics and goal setting, salon operation, and record keeping. Prerequisites: Successful completion of CSME 1453, 2237, 2401, and 2439 with minimum grade C. Semester Hours 4 (3 Lec/3 Lab)
