Methods of Teaching and Learning:

This course will rely on lecture, class work, group work, and discussion.

Course Objectives and/or Competencies:

To practice and develop writing processes pertaining to invention, revision, organization, drafting through multiple drafts, editing, and adjusting for rhetorical context (purpose, audience, persona).

To discuss and share writing and reading with one another and develop a shared vocabulary for talking about writing.

To practice critical thinking processes such as abstracting, representing, incorporating, and synthesizing the ideas of others through writing.

To produce readable and interesting finished products that reflect appropriate academic textual conventions of presentation.

Course Grading Information:

Essay #1 (Literacy Narrative): 15%

Essay #2 (Concept Exposition): 20%

Essay #3 (Profile Narrative): 25%

Essay #4 (Position Essay): 35%

Daily Work/Quizzes/Etc.: 5%

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Plagiarism on any of the essays will result in a 0 for that assignment. The term plagiarism, as defined by McLennan Community College, includes but is not limited to, the use, by paraphrase or direct quotation, of the published or unpublished work of another person without full and clear acknowledgment. It also includes the unacknowledged use of materials prepared by another person or agency engaged in the selling of term papers or other academic materials—this can also mean using one’s own work turned in twice for two different courses.

Late Work, Attendance, and Make Up Work Policies:

These essays compose the majority of the grades in the class. Before every paper is due, students will bring a hard copy of their paper to class for a peer-review session. At this session, each student will read three other papers, and then their paper will be read three times. The hard copy is worth 10% of the total grade for *that* paper. The final copies of each paper will be due online via brightspace—for each day late, 2 points will be taken off the total grade of that paper.

Paper will be turned in both online and in person.

In order to complete other work, one must have missed due to an excused absence. “I overslept” is not a valid excuse—even though we do start at 7:30 a.m.
