Course Description:

Individual Instruction, rehearsal of vocal repertoire. Involves one private lesson per week. May be repeated for credit. Special emphasis on music theory written and aural skills.

Prerequisites and/or Co-requisites:

None

Course Notes and Instructor Recommendations:

This is a companion course to voice lessons, MUAP 1281, and also Theory and Sight-singing and Ear Training courses. Students are given the opportunity to practice with a teacher outside of theory class and lessons with an emphasis on the learning process and accuracy.

You will need:

1. Assignments from each week.
2. A pencil for making marks in the score.

The course curriculum for MUEN 1151 satisfies the following Student Learning Outcomes:

To engage in the creative process or interpretive performance and comprehend the physical and intellectual demands required of the author or visual or performing artist.

Critical Thinking Skills - to include creative thinking, innovation, inquiry, and analysis, evaluation and synthesis of information. Embraces methods for applying both qualitative and quantitative skills analytically and creatively. Problem solving is one of the applications of critical thinking, used to address an identified task.

Communication Skills - to include effective development, interpretation and expression of ideas through written, oral and visual communication .

Reading at the college level means the ability to analyze and interpret a variety of printed materials -- books, articles, and documents. A core curriculum should offer students the opportunity to master both general methods of analyzing printed materials and specific methods for analyzing the subject matter of individual disciplines.
