# **Course Description:**

An interdisciplinary, multi-perspective assessment of cultural, political, philosophical and aesthetic factors critical to the formulation of values and the historical development of the individual and of society. Team-taught by faculty from diverse departments as a colloquium (academic seminar led by a different lecturer and on a different topic at each session). Works may include studies, journals, novels, poems, treatises, graphic novels, films, plays, paintings, musical compositions, etc. Semester Hours 3 (3 lec)

# **Prerequisites and/or Corequisites:**

The Honors Colloquium allows students to select, as available, a list of topics and readings from a larger group offered during the fall or spring semester. A colloquium is an academic meeting or seminar usually led by a different lecturer and on a different topic at each session. The Colloquium provides three hours of transferable academic credit in the Humanities. Unless notified, plan to meet all classes in the Honors College room (MAC 140). Faculty office hours are posted on BrightSpace in each professor's folder.
