Methods of Teaching and Learning:

Participation in projects and activities related to audio production, completing a student directed project within the time and date parameters assigned.

Course Objectives and/or Competencies:

Students will demonstrate the following skills to complete the competencies for this course:

- Participate in the team effort to work together in an audio workplace.
- Ability to demonstrate regular progress, and proper record-keeping.
- Ability to function effectively in a team.
- Ability to adapt and trouble-shoot audio production problems.
- Ability to produce a high-quality audio product.
- Ability to demonstrate a professional and courteous attitude at all classes and sessions.
- Ability to plan, organize, and complete audio recording sessions

Course Outline or Schedule:

This class will meet in the recording studio complex, and at the locations of the student's choice, at times to be announced. Audio and recording projects may include work outside of the studio complex completed at other locations.

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Course Grading Information:

A student's grade will be the cumulative total of the following criteria:

70% Performance on the weekly projects and competencies and objectives.

30% Attendance, professional attitude and conduct, completion of the required 5 performance reviews, as evaluated by instructor's observation.
