PHED 2112 - Walk for Life 2. This course reinforces the fundamental concepts of appropriate walking programs. This course will emphasize developing a walking program individualized for each student's unique needs. Students will be refreshed on the: proper warm up, cool down, walking techniques, use of proper clothing and shoes, weight loss, safety, flexibility, walking tests and mental benefits. # **Course Notes and Instructor Recommendations:**

Because Aerobic fitness is one of the key components of a balanced fitness plan - Walk for Life 2 - is an ideal class that incorporates knowledge and walking plans to achieve the goal. Students will demonstrate the basic motor skills related to fitness walking.

Students will become more knowledgeable on proper warm-up, cooldown, and stretching techniques that are appropriate for individuals involved in walking routines or up to date information on equipment, shoes, and a variety of local, state and national interesting walking locations.

Students will become familiar with various walking tests.

Students will plan, track, and execute a weekly walking exercise plan. They need to keep records in an exercise log.

Students will have the opportunity to individualize personal walking plans that are appropriate for Walk for Life 2.
